Instruction for authors submitting manuscripts to Surgery for Cerebral Stroke

- 1. Surgery for Cerebral Stroke is a journal covering primarily surgery for cerebral stroke and related field in basic and clinical studies including case reports and technical notes. Editorial Board reserves the right to judge the appropriateness of the studies.
- 2. Articles already published in any of other journals can not be accepted. Contribution of original articles in English from any country are welcome.
- 3. Experiments on human subjects must be in accordance with the ethical standards like as the Helsinki Declaration (approved in 1964, revised in 1984). Experimental studies on animals must meet appropriate ethical standards of the responsible committee.

It is not allowed that infringement or violation of right includes the use of copyrighted material such as figures or tables, use of photographs or descriptions, which may identify an individual, and quotation of unpublished results or private communication. Written permission must be obtained from the right holder and submitted with the manuscript.

- 4. One original and 2 copies of each manuscript should be submitted, typewritten in double space, on standard international paper (21.6×27.9 cm or $8^{1/2}$ ×11 inch) or A4 paper $(21.0 \times 29.7 \text{ cm})$, with 3 sets of any illustration, including figures and tables.
- 5. Manuscripts should meet the following instruction.
- a) The title page should carry title, full names of all authors with academic degrees, full name of the departments and institutes, and corresponding author's full name and address.
 - b) Abstract should not exceed 500 words in English.
- c) Key words must be no more than 5 words or phrases.
- d) Original article: Manuscript, including text, references and abstract, should be less than 8 pages. Number of illustrations including figures and tables should be less than 8.

Case report: Manuscript, including text, references and abstract, should be less than 5 pages. Number of illustrations including figures and tables should be less than 6.

Technical note: Manuscript, including text, references and abstract, should be less than 4 pages. Number of illustrations including figures and tables should be less than 6.

- e) Head of proper noun and German noun must be written in capital.
- f) Arabic numerals and standard metric units (μm, mm, cm, m, µl, dl, ml, l, µg, mg, g, kg) should be used throughout the manuscript.
 - g) Titles and detailed explanations of each figure and

table should be given in legends, not on figures. Size of figures should be 11 cm × 16 cm approximately. Letters, numbers, or symbols must not be applied directly to figures, but should be indicated on transparent paper covering figures. Staining method and magnification must be indicated for histological microscope photographs.

- h) Basically only black and white photographs will be accepted, but color photographs can be accepted with extra charge. Digital photographs will be only accepted with MO disk or CD and printed photographs.
- i) References cited in the article should be listed alphabetically. Superscripted citation number must be indicated in the text. References should be written in accordance with the following examples. A reference should include surnames and initials of three authors, and put "et al:" if the authors are more than three.

Abbreviated journal name in Index Medicus should be used. Subtitle of references must be included. When an abstract in proceedings of a conference is cited, indicate precise name of the conference like as "The 5th international conference on cerebral vasospasm (1997)" and put "(abstract)" afterward.

- k) Manuscripts can be returned to the author after publication by request.
