The KITAKANTO MEDICAL JOURNAL publishes original papers, review articles, case reports, and special categories on all aspects of medical and health sciences in Japanese and English. All authors must be members of the Kitakanto Medical Society. Manuscripts must be prepared in accordance with the international standards for authors (http://publicationethics.org/files/International% 20standards.authors.for%20website.11.Nov.2011.0.pdf) provided by Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE). In scientific investigations involving human subjects, experiments should be performed in accordance with the ethical standards formulated in the Helsinki Declaration of 1964 (revised in 1989) and the written permission from the research board of the authors' institution must be obtained beforehand. Similarly, animal experiments should follow the ethical standards formulated in the Helsinki Declaration, and the written permission from the ethics committee of the authors' institution must be obtained beforehand. The author must inform a major subject, a minor subject, and a supervisor to the chief editor when the paper will be presented as a dissertation for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy (Ph. D.).

Ethics

The Journal accepts manuscripts for possible publication on the understanding that the manuscripts are submitted only to the Journal, and have not been, and will not be, published elsewhere.

Authors must disclose conflicts of interest, potential or actual, when submitting their articles. See "Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts submitted to Biomedical Journals" (http://www.icmje.org/conflicts-of-interest/) for your reference. Authors are responsible for applying for permission for both print and electronic rights for all borrowed materials and for paying any fees required for such.

Copyrights

Authors must complete a transfer of copyright statement when submitting the manuscript.

Manuscript Preparation

Authors must submit manuscripts for original papers or case reports in triplicate and three sets of illustrations, comprised of one original and two copies of quality equal to the originals. The manuscript should be accompanied by THE KITAKANTO MEDICAL JOURNAL submission sheet containing transfer of copyright statement and checklist. All manuscripts must be written in 12 point typeface and double-spaced on single sides of A4 paper (210×297mm), with a margin of 27mm on all sides. Printed Manuscripts must be accompanied either by a CD-R, a USB memory, or a floppy disk containing the manuscript in Microsoft Word format (.doc, .docx). The manuscript must have a title page, an abstract, an introduction, materials and methods, results and discussion sections, references, and figure legends and tables, all beginning on new pages.

Title Pages

Title—A maximum of 120 characters with no abbreviations.

Short title—A maximum of 50 characters.

Authors—The full names of all authors and the names and full addresses of the departments and institutions where the work was performed.

Correspondence—The name, full address, e-mail address, telephone number and fax number of the corresponding author.

Abstract

The abstract must be informative, with a maximum of 200 words. Original papers should have headings of Background & Aims, Methods, Results, and Conclusions. This style is not necessary for case reports.

Key words—Must not exceed 5 words.

Body of Paper

Describe the ethical guidelines followed (for both human and animal studies) and cite the approvals of the institutional human research review committee or animal welfare committee. Outline the statistical methods used.

References

Cite references in order of appearance in text using superscript Arabic numerals.

Abbreviations must conform with those used in *Index Medicus*.

The names of no more than three authors should be given. Indicate the omission of more names with the abbreviation "et al".

Tables

Typed and double spaced, each table on a separate sheet. Numbered corresponding to the order of citation. The table number and title must be printed above the tables, and explanatory notes below.

Figure Legends

Typed and double spaced, numbered corresponding to the order of citation. Provide sufficient information so that figures can be understood without reference to the text.

Figures

Submit figures as mounted glossy photographs no smaller than 11×8cm. Computer files in TIFF (.tif) are accepted. Image resolution must exceed 350dpi. Contributors are required to pay for the printing of color figures.

Note—If you wish to have figures returned, please include a self-addressed envelope of appropriate size.

Correction or Retraction of a Published Article

If authors request a correction or retraction of a published article, the corresponding author of the article should obtain approval from all coauthors prior to submitting a request for a correction or retraction. The corresponding author should submit a written statement explaining the reason for a correction or retraction to the Editorial Office. The final decision for a correction or retraction will be made by the Editor-in-Chief. In the case of a correction or retraction of an article, the written statement explaining the reason, together with the bibliographical data of the article, will be published in the latest issue of our journal. The authors can submit the retracted article as a new one, if necessary corrections have been made.

Scientific Misconduct

If misconduct (e.g. data or figure manipulation, dual submission or plagiarism) is detected after a paper is published, it may be retracted by the Editor-in-Chief, and a note of retraction will then be published.

Publication Fees

Charges—Contributors are charged $$\pm 10,000$$ per printed page. The cost for pages including color figures is $$\pm 30,000$$ (the upper limit) each. Tax has to be payed Separately.

Reprints—Reprints are available in lots of 50. Contributors are charged for reprints.
