- # Any researcher and clinician interested in Comprehensive Medicine can contribute to the journal.
- # Manuscripts are accepted for review by referees. The journal will not accept articles in which a significant portion of the data has been published or submitted elsewhere. In any form of prior publication, in any language, a reprint or plain paper copy of the manuscript must accompany the article. If the editorial review board renders the submitted article not original, the manuscript will be returned without review. Each article is submitted with the understanding that all authors have seen and approved the final manuscript.

Manuscript Form: The size of sheets must be 8.5 X 11 inch (A4 size). Manuscripts should be double-spaced throughout, on good quality, non-erasable paper. A separate title page should be provided. Title, full name, address, academic affiliation, address for reprint request must be in the page. Abstract, text, key words (within 5 words) should begin on separate sheets with serial number and follow in that order. Each position of tables, legends, and figures in text must be marked on the margin in red. Define abbreviations at first appearance, and avoid use in the title and abstract. Use generic names of drugs.

Title: Title should be brief, specific and informative.

Abstract: Abstract should be concise description (not more than 800 words) of the purpose, method, results, and conclusion is required. Set 3-5 key words at the end of the abstract.

Reference: Number references consecutively in the order cited in the text, not alphabetically. Accuracy of reference data is the author's responsibility.
