

Instructions for Authors

Scope: Medical Mass Spectrometry is a peer-reviewed scientific journal, and publishes articles related to the use of mass spectrometry in biomedical fields. Submission of an article implies that the work has not been published or submitted for publication elsewhere except as a brief abstract in the proceedings of a scientific meeting or a symposium.

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Manuscript Submission: Manuscripts in Word files and their PDF files should be sent to the following secretariat of Japanese Society for Biomedical Mass Spectrometry by e-mail.

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Cover Letter: The manuscripts should be accompanied by a cover letter. The cover letter should contain significance of the work, novelty of the work, and contribution to the field.

Title Page: The title page should contain the name(s) of the author(s), the affiliation(s) and address(es) of the author(s), and the e-mail address, telephone and fax numbers of the corresponding author.

Abstract Page: The abstract page should contain an abstract of 150 to 250 words and 5 keywords. The abstract should not contain any undefined abbreviations or unspecified references.

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References: References must be numbered according to the order of appearance in the text and use superscript numbers with right side half brackets. For reference style, follow the examples listed below with journal abbreviations according to Cumulated Index Medicus. The names and the initials of the first five authors, followed by “et al” if there are other coauthors, should be listed.
